Introduction

The Department of Urban and Regional Planning provides both undergraduate and postgraduate professional training in Urban and Regional Planning. It was established in 1971. Since then, the department has trained most of the urban and regional planners in Kenya and has also trained for Eastern and Southern African countries. While most of the trained Planners have joined their countries' respective ministries as physical planners, many of the planners have found their way into Universities, international organizations and NGOs, whose development activities focus on urban and regional planning, the management of the natural and the built environment and community development.

Bachelor of Arts in Planning

The Bachelor of Arts (Planning) programme aims to train professional planners in urban and regional planning who are competent to offer planning services to the government, including local authorities, regional development agencies, private sector, non -governmental organizations, and other agencies. The course also caters for those who wish to pursue policy and research oriented careers in planning. In the second category, the programme caters for those who wish to pursue higher degrees in planning at masters and doctorate levels. The programme is designed to balance planning theory, methodology and techniques courses, with those intended to meet planning application needs. The Bachelor of Arts in Planning is a development management oriented programme, tailored to enable the graduate to serve the various sectors of society including the economic sectors.

Entry Requirements

For KCSE holder or equivalent: Overall Grade C+ and a minimum of Grade C+ in the following subject clusters:

- Mathematics
- Physics, Chemistry Biology
- History, Government, Geography, Christian Religious Education; Islamic Religious Education; Hindu Religious Education;
- Home Science, Art and Design, Agriculture, Aviation Technology, Computer Studies
- French, German, Arabic, Music, Business Studies.

A holder of KACE (A-level) or equivalent;

- two principal passes in mathematics or economics
- geography, biology, physics, chemistry, history and a credit pass in English language at KCE or equivalent examination.

Diploma holders:

- KNEC/ordinary diploma/Higher diploma in land surveying, cartography, GIS/RS, photogrammetry, building construction, architecture, applied sciences or related fields with a credit pass or equivalent.
- Diploma certificates from science and technical colleges with credit pass in mathematics, geography, agriculture, forestry or agricultural engineering.

Degree holders

A holder of University degree or its equivalent from a recognized University in the following subjects: economics, mathematics, geography, land surveying, architecture, building economics, planning, agriculture or any other relevant degree.

Course Structure and Duration

- The course is covered in seventy (70) course units consisting of lecturers, studio, workshops, class presentations, fieldwork, demonstrations, supervisions/ consultation and professional attachment.
- 2. Students will undergo continuous assessment by written assignments and/or class presentations and/or studio.
- 3. Each candidate is required to take all the course units shown during the semester; 1st year 16 units; 2nd year 18 units; 3rd year 18 units; 4th year 18 units
- 4. Each academic year is divided into two teaching semesters and a third semester for practical attachment.

Master of Arts in Planning

Introduction

The Master of Arts in Planning Programme aims to train a high caliber of professionally qualified personnel in Urban and Regional Planning. The programme provides planners with the requisite skills and specialized knowledge needed to address numerous challenges associated with rapid urbanization and resource use in Africa. The Department of Urban and Regional Planning has been a leading institution for training professional planners in the entire Eastern and Southern African region.

The regulations and syllabus for the degree of Master of Arts in Planning have recently been revised to introduce a new approach in planning and provide flexibility for candidates to pursue the course on a semester basis.

The programme incorporates theoretical foundations of planning and a strong practical and professional training, along with multi-disciplinary knowledge in planning areas, methods of research and analysis and computer application skills. The course is intended for graduates and professionals with relevant educational background and experience who wish to take up planning roles with public, private, voluntary and international agencies working at local, sub-national, national and international levels

Entry Requirements

A holder of a Bachelor's degree, of at least upper second class honors in planning, architecture, land economics, building economics, civil engineering, design, surveying, agriculture, law, economics, geography, sociology, government, anthropology, social work or any other relevant discipline from the University of Nairobi or any other institution recognized by Senate as being of comparable academic status.

A holder of a Bachelor's degree, of lower second class honors in any of the degree categories specified above with a relevant postgraduate diploma or other equivalent qualifications from the University of Nairobi or any other institution recognized by Senate as being of comparable academic status or with at least two (2) years of relevant work experience.

A holder of a pass degree in any of the degree categories specified in above with a credit in a relevant postgraduate diploma or other equivalent qualifications from the University of Nairobi or any other institution recognized by Senate as being of comparative academic status, and at least (5) years of relevant work experience.

Course Structure and Duration

The programme is covered in thirty-four (34) course units consisting of lectures, seminars, fieldwork, practical (studio), research project and examinations.

A candidate shall be allowed to take a minimum of three (3) course units and a maximum of nine (9) course units per semester.

The programme shall be covered in a minimum of four (4) semesters and a maximum of twelve (12) semesters.

All courses, seminars, studio, research project and examinations are compulsory. The programme shall proceed from levels one to four:

The Research Project shall constitute four (4) course units while the Rural, Urban and Regional Planning Studio shall constitute two, three and four course units respectively.

The programme is examined through written examinations, course work, planning studio and research project.


